AI Cameras: Continuous Monitoring

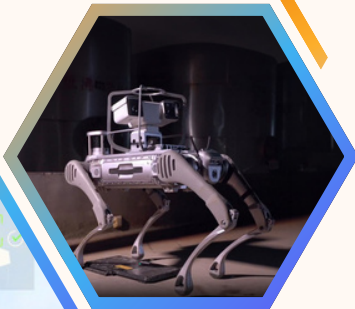
AI-enabled cameras monitor key operational areas and automatically identify potential safety, environmental, and operational concerns.

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Robotic Dogs: Safe and Consistent Inspections

Alliance's robotic dog autonomously inspects the plants, collecting real-time data while improving inspection consistency and reducing exposure to high-risk areas.

Innovative Concrete Solution for Guangdong Construction's Project

Alliance recently supported Guangdong Construction's Hoi Faan Road project in Tai Kok Tsui with an innovative concrete solution. The project involves the development of a permanent office and ancillary facilities for the Central Government Office in the HKSAR.

Meeting Complex Construction Challenges

The project presented several technical challenges, including:

- **Dense reinforcement layouts** that increased the risk of blockage, honeycombing, and voids during concrete placement.
- **Restricted access for vibration equipment**, making conventional concrete consolidation methods unsuitable.
- **Stringent strength and durability requirements** for this high-profile development.



Tailored Grade 80/10 Self-Compacting Concrete (SCC) Solution

To address the project's complex construction requirements, Alliance developed and supplied a tailored Grade 80/10 SCC solution. **The customized mix, featuring a maximum 10mm aggregate size, enabled smooth placement through highly congested reinforcement areas while eliminating the need for vibration.** Designed for both high strength and excellent pumpability, the concrete ensured efficient placement and reliable performance. Careful temperature control throughout the process further supported consistent quality and strength development, helping the project meet its demanding technical requirements.

MTRC Waterproofing and Triple Blend Study - Advancing Sustainable Waterproofing Solutions

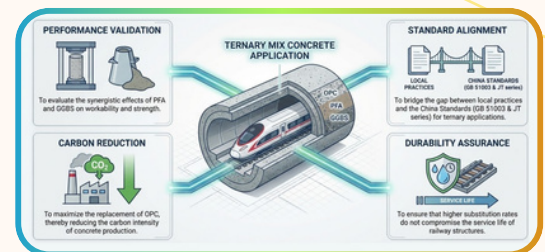
Alliance supported MTRC's waterproofing innovation initiative, which explores the **use of waterproofing admixtures in concrete as an alternative to traditional external membranes.** This approach has the potential to simplify construction, reduce labour requirements, and enhance sustainability performance.

Extensive Testing and Collaboration

Working alongside industry partners, Alliance participated in an extensive research programme involving more than 100 days of testing across 24 concrete mix designs. The study evaluated key performance indicators including water absorption, durability, crack resistance, and compressive strength.

Supporting ESG and Future Railway Standards

The study developed ternary concrete blends using OPC, PFA, and GGBS to reduce carbon emissions, increase cement replacement, and improve durability, supporting lower-carbon railway standards in Hong Kong and MTRC's ESG goals.



Building a Stronger Safety Culture Together



In 2026, Alliance further strengthened its commitment to Health, Safety and Environment (HSE) by engaging both employees and business partners through two milestone seminars. Alliance's Annual HSE Seminar, held in June under the theme "Safety in Every Step", reaffirmed that safety is a core value embedded in every aspect of the company's operations. To broaden this commitment throughout its value chain, Alliance convened its **first HSE Seminar for Contractors and Suppliers** in September, which brought together key business partners to promote a shared responsibility for health, safety, environmental protection, and business integrity.

Across both events, management emphasized that safety remains Alliance's top priority and highlighted the importance of collaboration in fostering a strong safety culture, creating safer workplaces and supporting sustainable business operations.

Participants also received a newly launched **Contractor HSE Booklet** outlining key health, safety and environmental requirements. The event strengthened collaboration across the supply chain and reinforced a shared HSE commitment.



Supporting Hung Shui Kiu/ Ha Tsuen New Development Area and MTR Hung Shui Kiu Station 1801

Alliance supported the Hung Shui Kiu / Ha Tsuen New Development Area (HSK/HT NDA) and MTRC's Hung Shui Kiu Station (Contract No. 1801) with a reliable supply of aggregate solutions. As a flagship development under Hong Kong's Northern Metropolis strategy, HSK/HT NDA will serve as a major modern services hub in the western New Territories.

During Q2 2026, Alliance supplied over 30,000 tonnes of rock products for critical site formation and backfilling works, including the backfilling of a significant karst cave beneath MTR Hung Shui Kiu Station.

Despite tight project timelines and complex logistics, our team successfully coordinated and delivered the required materials within a compressed timeframe, ensuring uninterrupted construction progress. This achievement underscores Alliance's capability to provide dependable, large-scale material solutions that support Hong Kong's strategic infrastructure development.

Health & Safety

Driver HSE Hotline Strengthens Safety Communication

Alliance launched the Driver HSE Hotline to encourage drivers and logistics operators to report HSE concerns and improvement suggestions through hotline, email, and Teams channels.

The hotline covers issues related to workplace safety, driving safety, welfare facilities, environmental incidents, and other potential HSE risks. All reports are reviewed confidentially by independent management personnel, with follow-up actions taken where necessary.

The initiative has already generated valuable feedback, including concerns about road conditions near our Tsing Yi Concrete Hub, with improvement actions underway. By strengthening communication with frontline employees, Alliance continues to foster a proactive and inclusive safety culture.



Heat-Stroke Safety Promotion 2026

To protect operational staff and drivers during the summer months, Alliance launched its Heat-Stroke Safety Promotion 2026 in August, reinforcing awareness of heat-related risks and the importance of staying safe while working outdoors.

The campaign included safety memos, onsite posters and awareness materials, alongside safety briefings and direct engagement with drivers. Key messages focused on hydration, rest breaks, recognising signs of heat stress, and reporting symptoms promptly.

To support the initiative, cold drinks, cold packs and other safety materials were distributed to frontline workers. Special attention was given to driver activities involving prolonged heat exposure, such as vehicle inspections, unloading operations and waiting in marshalling areas.

Emergency Drills Strengthen Marine Safety Readiness

To enhance HSE awareness and emergency preparedness, Alliance launched a series of emergency drills on aggregates and cement barges in collaboration with two barge operators from April 2026.

Aggregates Barges - Fire and Man-overboard Incident Drills

- Crews were well briefed and communicated effectively before the drills
- AED equipment was deployed onboard to strengthen rescue preparedness
- AI tools were used to enhance HSE communication and engagement

Cement Barges - Cement Leakage Incident Drills

- Absorbent materials and emergency response kits were prepared and tested during the drills
- Training was provided to all operators before the exercise

The drills demonstrated strong teamwork, rapid response, and a deeper understanding of emergency procedures, reinforcing Alliance's commitment to safe and resilient marine operations.



Alliance Strengthens Fall Prevention with 3-Point Contact Campaign



To reduce risks of falls, slips, and trips among drivers, a series of 3-point contact safety promotion initiatives has been launched across operations.

Drivers are reminded to follow the 3-point contact rule when climbing or descending ladders, vehicles, or equipment, maintaining three points of contact at all times:



2 Feet + 1 Hand



2 Hands + 1 Foot

A Safety Alert was issued to all drivers, supported by safety posters and vehicle stickers promoting the 3-point contact rule to prevent falls from vehicle cabins. Safety conversations with truck and loader operators further reinforced dynamic risk assessment and safe work practices, particularly in response to changing site and vehicle conditions. The initiative aims to strengthen safe behaviours and reduce fall-related incidents across operations.

HSE Award Recognises Outstanding Logistics Partners

To promote a proactive safety culture, Alliance launched the **HSE Award Scheme for Aggregates and Cement Logistics Vendors** in May 2026. The programme recognises logistics partners for outstanding HSE performance, including hazard reporting, continuous improvement, and active participation in HSE initiatives.
